With the mission of ‘Leading positive change in agriculture’, the [Nuffield Farming Scholarships Trust](#) was established in the 1960s. It has since enabled more than 1,200 UK scholars to travel around the world to investigate their chosen topics. The trust now has 11 member countries, and a further 10 countries represented via Nuffield International.

This year celebrates AHDB’s 10th anniversary of sponsoring Nuffield Farming Scholars. The first scholar we sponsored, Russ McKenzie, studied [‘Success with no-till – under any conditions’](#) and, in true Nuffield spirit, he has reciprocated by working closely with AHDB in subsequent years. Russ was a monitor farmer for three years, spent two terms on the Cereals & Oilseeds Sector Council and sits on the Recommended List Project Board.
