

Great BRITISH BEEF Week

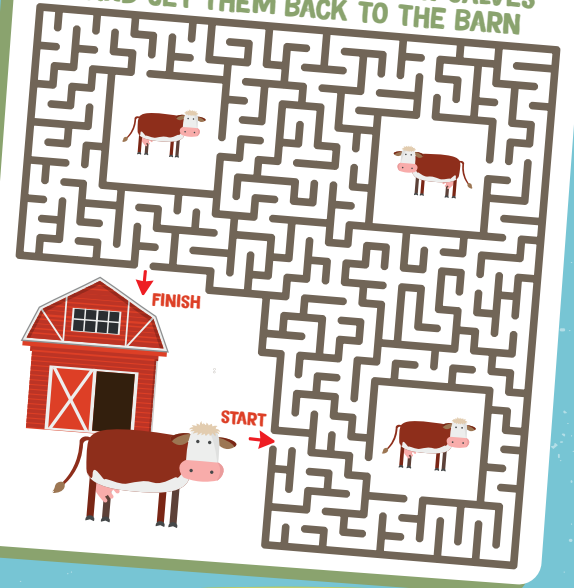
It's time to celebrate Great British Beef Week and our 'Naturally Delicious' British Beef. Famous around the world for its quality and sustainability, British Beef aims to be carbon neutral by 2050! We get our beef from 34 different breeds of cows who live together in groups called herds. A young female cow is called a heifer and a baby is called a calf. 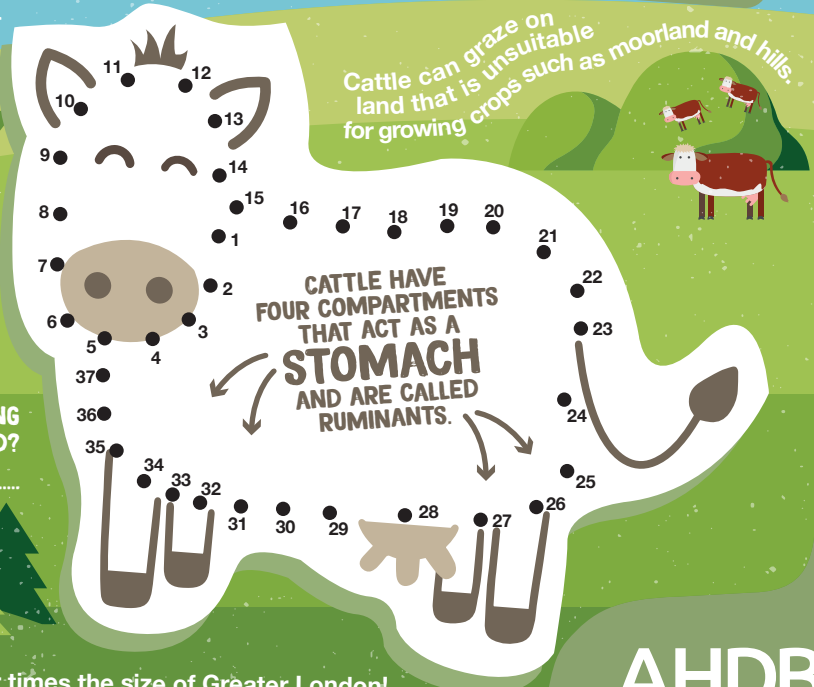
Farmers look after the countryside, maintaining habitat for wildlife such as birds and bees.
