Basic Principles: Obligations



- Trade without discrimination
 - Most favoured Nation Principle (MFN)
 - National Treatment Principle
- Predictability
 - Respect of Bindings (Goods and Services)
 - Transparency (Notifications, Trade Policy Review)
- Freer trade (elimination of trade barriers through negotiations)
 - Tariff reductions
 - Prohibition of quantitative restrictions (quotas ≠ Tariff Rate Quota)








Formulation	Examples (bound duties)
Specific: specific units of currency are levied per unit of quantity (e.g., weight, surface, piece, head, etc.)	9.3 €/100 kg/net European Union (barley other)
Mixed : a conditional choice between an <i>ad valorem</i> duty and a specific duty, subject to an upper and/or a lower limit	204% or SDR 1.92/kg whichever is higher, Iceland (tomatoes, fresh or chilled)
Compound: a duty comprising an <i>ad valorem</i> duty to which a specific duty is either added or subtracted	12.8 + 171.3 €/100 kg/net European Union (carcases and half carcases of lamb, fresh or chilled)
Other (residual category): duties are determined by complex technical factors. For example, the percentage content of the agricultural component (sugar, milk, alcohol content, etc.) determines the amount of the duty	1.4606¢/kg less 0.020668¢/kg for each degree under 100 degrees (and fractions of a degree in proportion) but not less than 0.943854¢/kg United States (Raw cane sugar)


Average tariffs - agricultural products Main agricultural importers (%)





















How to address trade related concerns in the WTO SPS example



Conditions under which a SPS Measure can be taken:

- Restrain trade to protect health
- Measures <u>based on scientific principles</u> (international standards or risk assessment)
- Non-discriminatory
- No disguised restrictions

Transparency


- Notifications new of changed SPS regulations in draft form
- In case no international standard or different from the standard AND may have significant effect on trade
- ≈ 23,000 SPS notifications

Addressing SPS Trade Concerns

- 1. Bilateral and/or Regional Efforts (especially if under RTA)
 - a. Contact trading partner's enquiry point (article 5.8)
 - b. Exchanges through diplomatic representations, in Geneva...
- 2. SPS Committee Specific Trade Concerns (raised by Members in the SPS Committee in relation to SPS measures maintained by other Member)
- 1. Good Offices of the SPS Committee Chair (article 12.2)
- 2. WTO Dispute Settlement System



Dispute Settlement

 Arises when a Member believes another is violating an agreement or commitment made

Only involves governments

 Not a WTO dispute until the Member country notifies WTO Secretariat that a dispute exists

Importantly for SPS Trade Problems: Dispute Settlement of OIE and IPPC



IPPC

Technical dispute settlement body

OIE

Technical mediation

> Pros:

- Technical evaluation only
- No involvement of lawyers
- Less costly

> Cons:

- Enforcement difficulties
- Not binding


