Persons using the product to which this Extension of authorisation applies should acquaint themselves with and observe all requirements contained in the Regulation (EC) No 1107/2009, including the duty on the holder of any Extension of authorisation to notify information on potentially dangerous effects, a contravention of which is a criminal offence under those Regulations.
5. Neither the efficacy nor the phytotoxicity of the product for which this Extension of authorisation has been granted has been assessed and, as such, the user bears the risk in respect of failures concerning its efficacy and phytotoxicity.

ADVISORY INFORMATION

IMPORTANT: When applying this product under the terms of this Extension of Authorisation, comply with any resistance guidance or restrictions stated on the product label.

Total reliance on one pesticide will hasten the development of resistance. Pesticides of different chemical types or alternative control measures should be included in the planned programme. Alternating with different modes of action is a recognised anti-resistance strategy.

Where aphids resistant to products containing pyrethroids occur, this product is unlikely to give satisfactory control. Repeat treatments are likely to result in lower levels of control. For aphid control use a suitable aphicide depending on other pests present. Consult a BASIS qualified agronomist.

Where flea beetles resistant to products containing pyrethroids occur, this product is unlikely to give satisfactory control. Repeat treatments are likely to result in lower levels of control. For flea beetle control use a suitable insecticide depending on other pests present. Consult a BASIS qualified agronomist.

This Extension of Authorisation relates to the use of 'Decis Protech' (M16160) on courgette, summer squash, cucumber and gherkin for the control of Western Flower Thrips and Leaf Miner (*Liriomyza bryoniae*, *Chromatomyia syngenesiae*). The maximum individual application rate of 117 ml product in 100 l water in permanent protected full enclosure and 50 ml product in 100 l water in protected situations should be observed. Application should be via a conventional hydraulic sprayer in maximum water volume of 1000 l per hectare.

Applications must not be made to crops grown outdoors including those crops where protection in the establishment phase (e.g. fleece covers) has subsequently been removed. Applications can be made in protected situations where the protection remains throughout (e.g. polytunnels and spanish tunnels).

APPENDIX 1: CONDITIONS OF EXTENSION OF AUTHORISATION

The conditions below are obligatory. They must be complied with when the Extension of authorisation occurs. Failure to comply with the following conditions will result in the withdrawal or amendment of the Extension of authorisation under Regulation (EC) No 1107/2009 and may result in other enforcement action, including prosecution. For the purposes of this Extension of authorisation only, the conditions and/or requirements shown below supersede any corresponding conditions and/or requirements set out on the label or otherwise provided for under the product authorisation **which would otherwise apply**.

Operator Protection:

- (1) Engineering control of operator exposure must be used where reasonably practicable in addition to the following personal protective equipment:

Workers must wear suitable protective clothing in which arms, body and legs are fully covered when re-entering treated areas or handling treated crops or contaminated surfaces within 15 days after treatment. (See 'Other Specific Restrictions').

- (2) However, engineering controls may replace personal protective equipment if a COSHH assessment shows that they provide an equal or higher standard of protection.

Environmental protection:

- (1) Crops/situations with >5m buffer zone:

Since there is a risk to aquatic life from use, direct spray from horizontal boom and hand held sprayers must not be allowed to fall within the distance specified for the crop of the top of the bank of any static or flowing waterbody or within 1m of the top of a ditch which is dry at the time of application.

Spray must be aimed away from water.

- (2) Buffer zones must be measured in accordance with the guidance set out in the HSE Chemicals Regulation Division's website and any amendments made to it.
- (3) The results of the LERAP must be recorded in written form and must be available for a period of three years for inspection to any person entitled to exercise enforcement powers under or in connection with the Plant Protection Products Regulations 2011 or the Plant Protection Products (Sustainable Use) Regulations 2012. (An electronic record will satisfy the requirement for a written record, providing it is similarly available for inspection and can be copied).
- (4) Where the buffer zone is greater than 5m then it must not be reduced under the LERAP scheme.
- (5) For fogging applications, to protect surface waters do not vent the treated facility for 12 hours after application. Do not use in facilities within 30 m of surface water bodies. Only use fogging applications in fully enclosed facilities where no gaps exist in the

protection and where fog is unable to escape to the external environment prior to venting

- (6) To protect non target insects / arthropods respect an unsprayed buffer zone of 5m to non-crop land.

Other specific restrictions:

- (1) This product must only be applied in accordance with the terms of this extension of authorisation, the product label and/or leaflet and any additional guidance on extensions of authorisation.
- (2) Managers must carry out a thermal comfort checklist (see - <http://www.hse.gov.uk/temperature/assets/docs/thermal-comfort-checklist.pdf>) prior to worker re-entry tasks. If needed, an additional heat stress check list and associated risk assessment must be undertaken (see- <http://www.hse.gov.uk/temperature/assets/docs/heat-stress-checklist.pdf>) and the records retained. Temperature and humidity inside tunnels should be monitored during re-entry tasks. If conditions become such that there is a risk of heat related illness, or workers complain of ill effects, then work must cease until the risk is reduced. It is not acceptable for workers to remove clothing and continue working.
- (3) A minimum interval of 7 days must be observed between applications
- (4) This product must only be used on the authorised crops when the protection remains on the crops during application and throughout the life of the crop.

APPENDIX 2: GENERAL CONDITIONS FOR AN EXTENSION OF AUTHORISATION

Failure to comply with the following conditions will result in the withdrawal or amendment of the Extension of authorisation under Regulation (EC) No 1107/2009 and may result in other enforcement action, including prosecution.

Adverse effects:

The authorisation holder must immediately notify the Secretary of State, the Scottish Ministers and the Department of Agriculture, Environment and Rural Affairs in Northern Ireland (care of the Health and Safety Executive), if they have any new information on the potentially adverse effects of the authorised product, or of residues of an active substance in that product when used in accordance with the conditions of this Extension of authorisation. For those products authorised under Regulation (EC) No 1107/2009 authorisation holders must also tell the other relevant competent authorities of the EC Member States (a list of which is available from the Health and Safety Executive) and the EC Commission. Failure to comply with this requirement is an offence.

Provision of information:

The authorisation holder must comply with all requests for information required by, or on behalf of, the Secretary of State, the Scottish Ministers or the Department of Agriculture, Environment and Rural Affairs in Northern Ireland in accordance with Regulation (EC) No 1107/2009.
