

SPRAZING GLZPHOSATE? WATCHOUT FOR SEED POTATO CROPSI

Guidance for farm owners and sprayer operators on USING GLYPHOSATE SAFELY near sensitive seed potato crops

AVOID CROP DAMAGE LIKE THIS

Glyphosate can contaminate seed potato crops through

- Contaminated equipment
- 📣 Drift from nearby spraying



Even if quantities are very low (and undetectable) this can result in very poor performance of seed in the following season.

The following tips will help **reduce contamination** please **share** them with your **staff**, **neighbours** and local **contractors**; (contractors should be reputable and should provide evidence of PA certification. If possible, they should have dedicated sprayers for potatoes).

SIMPLE STEPS TO SAFE USE

- Always follow good wash-out procedures using a double-rinse procedure (eg: with All Clear Extra).
- Leave suitable headland of unsprayed crop (grass/cereal) or avoid planting up to fence/dyke/wall/hedge.
- Before spraying Glyphosate within 100m of potatoes, check wind direction.
- Avoid spraying herbicide when air speed at boom height >4mph (6.5km/hr); spraying any chemical inadvisable when air speed at boom height >6 mph (9.6 km/hr). (Visit www.hgca.com for latest guidance on low-drift spraying).
- Check your speed spraying at excessive speed promotes boom bounce, sending spray droplets higher into the air.
- Avoid very hot and calm days when convection currents carry spray droplets.
- Use low drift nozzles (LERAP 3* rating), especially in windy/gusty conditions.
- Use an anti-drift agent based on polyacrylamide with Glyphosate, (e.g. Companion Gold).
- Check weather conditions avoid spraying in high temperatures, low relative humidity or if temperature inversion likely, eg: following clear nights.
- Trees and hedges nearby cause localised air currents, especially in gusty conditions.
- Follow appropriate "Code of Practice for Using Plant Protection Products".
- It's a legal requirement to keep clear, up-todate spraying records.
