

### GB ANIMAL FEED PRODUCTION

#### KEY POINTS

- 8.5% less wheat and 1.8% less barley was used to produce GB animal feed <sup>(1)</sup> in July 2019 than in July 2018.
- In July 2019, GB animal feed production <sup>(1)</sup> was up 6.3% for pigs and down 2.3% for poultry <sup>(1)</sup>, 12.1% for cattle and calves and 40.1% sheep.
- July 2019 is the first month of the 2019/20 season, which runs from July to June.
