

## GB ANIMAL FEED PRODUCTION

### KEY POINTS

- In July 2020, GB animal feed production<sup>(1)</sup> was up 17.3% for sheep, 2.2% for cattle and calves, 0.2% for pigs and down 4.0% for poultry<sup>(1)</sup>, compared with July 2019.
- 3.3% less wheat and 23.9% more barley was used to produce GB animal feed<sup>(1)</sup> in July compared with the same period in 2019.
- July 2020 is the first month of the 2020/21 season, which runs from July to June.
